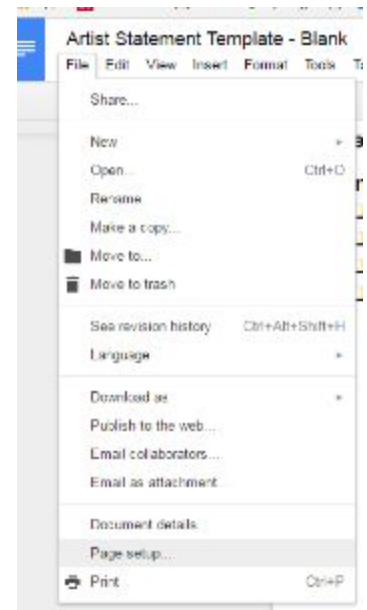


Artist Statement Worksheet

Page Setup: Use this layout as your template.

Click on “File” - “Page SetUp”

- .5 inch margins all sides
- Times New Roman style Font, Size 12
- Left Align
- Line Spaces change to 1.15

Page color

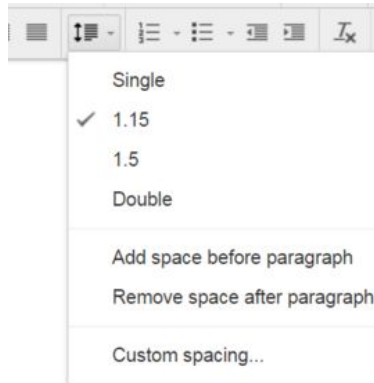
Margins (inches)

Format: It should look like this.

Name: (type your first and last name)

Title: (name it something - use “quotation marks”)

Medium: (list materials you used e.g. graphite, acrylic paint)

Grade: (write your grade level)

(skip a line)

Start the beginning of your artist statement. (1-2 sentences)

Have supporting information for the opening sentences. (3-5 sentences)

Closing sentence that mentions your opening sentence topic. (1-2 sentences)

Example:

Name: Gaye Ellington

Title: “Painting of Duke Ellington”

Medium: Oil Paint

Grade: 12th
